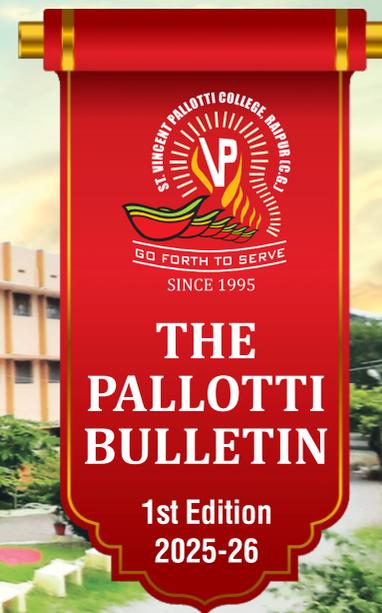

- Avoid comparing yourself with others. Everyone has their own pace and path. Focus on progress, not perfection.
- Lastly, remember that seeking help is a sign of strength, not weakness. Visiting a counsellor or therapist can help you feel better and handle problems more confidently.

Mental health matters just as much as physical health. Seeking help doesn't make you less capable — it shows courage. After all, a healthy mind is the first step toward a truly successful college life.

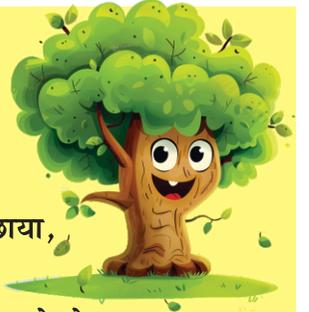
